

Rules for filming/or taking photos at the riding school

- Filming in riding classes or on other activities is *not allowed*.
- Filming in the stable is *not allowed*.
- Filming on a private lesson is *allowed after agreement with the riding teacher and if the guardian has given approval*.
- Taking photos of the horses is *allowed*.
- Taking photos of an individual student in the stable/riding lesson is *allowed only by the guardian or by the parent's approval*.



Regarding rules for filming /or taking photos at the riding school.

The GDPR law means that it is not allowed to publish, for example, names and pictures/videos of people who have not approved this.

The riding school is a place where we should all feel safe, secure and get new energy together with our horses, it is also a workplace for us who are employed by the club. We therefore choose to introduce rules from 1 Nov-22 on filming / taking photos at the riding school as we have seen that it can have a negative impact on both the individual and our business.

Filming in class or other activities is no longer allowed. The riding teacher, in consultation with the riding group, will possibly film on one or a few occasions during the semester and then watch together with the students in theory lesson for educational purposes.

Filming in the stable is not allowed, we want the focus to be on the horses and the safety of our students/visitors in the stable.

Filming in a private lesson is allowed by agreement with the riding teacher and if the guardian has given approval

Taking photos of the horses is allowed.

Taking photos of an individual student in the stable or at a riding lesson is only allowed by the guardian or if the guardian has given his or her approval. That is, taking a picture of yourself or of your relative is okay as long as no one else is in the picture.

With the rules, we at the riding school want to create a safe place for everyone to be, where no one should feel worried about possibly ending up on a film that later appears on social media.

The stable is a meeting place where we want everyone to have fun, learn things, meet friends, feel proud of their riding and just be themselves.

Feel free to talk to your child about our new rules, we will also inform the students in theory lesson.
